

The Sharon Audubon Center is a nature center owned and operated by the National Audubon Society. Located in the northwest corner of Connecticut, in the town of Sharon, the Sharon Audubon Center has a newly renovated Raptor Center, over eleven miles of scenic hiking trails, and includes 1,147 acres of mixed forest, meadows, wetlands, ponds and streams.

The mission of the National Audubon Society is to conserve and restore natural ecosystems focusing on birds, other wildlife, and their habitats for the benefit of the Earth's biological diversity and humanity. The Sharon Audubon Center strives to meet this mission through education, conservation and environmental research to encourage the responsible use and stewardship of natural lands.
